Fiftly, you are to Associate wth any, the friends
Indians to any number you shall find most

Out in your march or in your Quarters you are
to take speciall Care, that no English
Doe Fight or wrastle wth any Indians so
to avoid all Occasions of Quarrell -

Com^{mand} to Colloth William Evans for the raising
of fifty persons in the foregoing Ord^r (viz)

Immediately upon sight hereof you are to Cause
fifty able men to be pressed out of St Marys
County, wth sufficient Shott Armes, and to finde
out a fitt person to Command them and also to
presse for every man soe raised, two poundes
of powder or a like quantity of Shott -

And you are to impower the person by you to
be placed in Command over the said fifty men
to quarter the said men in their March up
to Capt William Burges in Amherst County
or else to presse sufficient provisions for the use
of the said march to him; And Order the said
Command^r Command^r the said Burges to March
and him to Obey, Or his Colloth Lewis
Shockett when you shall further Order from
me, And this shall be your warrant
und^{er} my hand att St Marys this 6th day
of August 1665 - Charles Calvert

From Mutatis Mutandis to Major Thomas
Brooke for 40 men out of Calvert County
20 of them the Chifs and 20 in Porters
vicer to march to Capt^r wth Burges
From Mutatis mutandis to Capt Robert
Brooke for 30 men out of Charles County
to march at sea
