 that the officers commanding of parties exchange  
 any men they find in their company unfit for the  
 service & to press others in the rooms within the County  
 out of which they had their parties

That Rich<sup>d</sup> Freeman the Indian be put in the room  
 of y<sup>e</sup> one of Lieut Boquet men of y<sup>e</sup> M<sup>o</sup> & remain  
 with his troop & building & that his troop be housed  
 as other y<sup>e</sup> soldiers are housed by the hund<sup>s</sup> & his  
 housing built by the Carpenters that are to pay work  
 & that in case any greater damage come to him than  
 ordinary it shall be borne by an equal charge upon  
 the province

That as by former order of the Council the troops of  
 all the soldiers sent out now to be housed by the hund<sup>s</sup>  
 for six weeks now in regard they are to stay out longer  
 that the Reporters hundred shall tend the troops of  
 the Sold<sup>rs</sup> till they be housed if they stay out so  
 long

That the Command<sup>rs</sup> take care that the Ammunition be not  
 unnecessarily shott away & that when the soldiers  
 are dismissed they do not permit them to carry away  
 more Ammunition than is absolutely necessary for their  
 defence

Further order that Thomas Mather J<sup>r</sup>  
 send to the Emperours of Cascutaway and the  
 rest of the Indian Kings in Colomocke order to send  
 out parties to search for the Enemy Indians as now  
 abroad

was this day issued from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council and  
 Deputy Govern<sup>r</sup>. to all the Constables of each respective  
 hundred, to warn the soldiers within their hundred to  
 appear at the mill at Newtowne on Saturday next  
 by 12 of the Clock with one fired gun and one pound of powder  
 and 3 pound of shot with a days provisions and to give notice to
