Proclamation as soon as conveniently may be
after Receipt of this writt, att the direction of
the freemen of your County, you cause one, two,
three or four discreet Burgeesses to be
Elected, to serve in the said Assembly, those
to do and Consent to such things as by
Common Consent shall happen to be Ordained
and Enacted in the said Burgeesses aforesaid, so that
through want of sufficient power & inconsiderate
Election of the aforesaid Burgeesses, & business
aforesaid may not remaine undone or neglected
And make you returns of this writt into your Secretarys
Office by the second day of January next
given at St Marys the Eight and twentieth
day of Octob. in the fourth and twentieth
year of Our Dominion Over the said
Province Amag Dominion One thousand
Six hundred Sixty five
