Ordered at a Provinciale Court
 holden the 10th of October 1665 — (wrl)

Whereas to be Remembred that this Eleavente day
 October one thousand six hundred sixty five Cometh
 the Governour and Councell in Provinciale Court assembled
 at Annapolis on one of the greates men of the Abawoman
 desired to know what was the Governours pleasure to
 doe with his nation vizy whether he would have them
 remove further of into the woods or to remaine upon
 the lands where they now or lately lived, for they were
 ready to obey his Comands, Whereupon the Governour
 desired the opinion of the Councell whether it were
 fitt to drive the said Indians further of or otherwise
 to continue them still upon their oulde habitation wher
 they are within our Comand. And it was y^e generall
 opinion of the Court that it was most for the safety
 of the Province to continue them now as a benign
 under our Comand. And thereupon Ordered

That the Abawoman Indians doe remaine upon
 their oulde habitation till further Order, And
 further it is Ordered that their lands be with all
 convenient speed laid out for them by certaine Warrants
 Comede within wherunto English man shall take
 up any land, And for as much as the generall
 peace and safety of the Province is more pertained
 then the Private Conventions of any particular
 persons whatsoever it is Ordered that now
