

Letter of Dominion granted to Thomas  
Barbery Subject to the Kingdoms of France  
by all Mutatis Mutandis put forth by date  
the 12<sup>th</sup> of October in the 35<sup>th</sup> year of  
our Dominion of Annoq<sup>ue</sup> Domini 1666.  
Witness our Dear Son Charles Calvert  
Esquire our Lieutenant Governour of our Pro-  
vince of Maryland.

June 16<sup>th</sup> 1666

Com<sup>mission</sup> upon reviewed and granted by Colonel  
Lewis Stockett mutatis mutandis for 205

At a Council held at St Marys  
the 17<sup>th</sup> day of Octob<sup>r</sup> 1666

Courson, Col. William Deans and Thomas Brumby.

As has been taken into Consideration the Confirmation of  
a Resolution made in the Province of Carolina by an  
Act of Assembly there made and sent hither under the  
hands of William Drummond Esq<sup>r</sup> Governour there of  
and George Catchmay Esq<sup>r</sup> Speaker of the said Assembly  
That to the vote cast for the said Act ought to be  
put in Execution or not, Major vote Consensus  
Whereupon Ordered by the Governour & Council that a Reso-  
lution be made brought hither which is named according to the  
Act made in this Province at an Assembly held the  
10<sup>th</sup> day of April last and all Clauses therein expressed  
to be duly observed and kept  
And further Ordered that the ensuing Proclamation  
doe forthwith issue to each respective County within this  
Province to be there proclaimed by the Sheriffs of  
each County that the Inhabitants thereof may be  
fully satisfied of the same

Which Proclamations do accordingly issue and the  
great Seal of this Province to each respective County
