All a Council held at Newport 6th Day of Aug. 1667

Capt John Dorer and his servant being lately murdered by some of the viccomets Indians, and satisfaction being of them demanded and to returne and deliver up those Indians (who committed the murder) by William Clessey Esq. being impowered therunto by the Governor, which said demand was utterly refused to be answered by them, alledging that the English had killed them a woman which they thought sufficient satisfaction, therefore did detain those four Indians now in Custody at St Marys (and lately taken prisoners by the English who stand until the murderers were brought in by the viccomets) should be delivered up, and that then they would make articles of peace with the English otherwise they would not

whereupon after a full Relation given of all proceedings by said Courteney being present in the said expedition to the towns of the viccomets and all the taking of the abovesaid four Indian prisoners by names Sawahcomere, Ough Sedough, Aughewitt Hannawitt, and Onawont the whole Council doth adjudge the said 4 Indians condemned to dye as enemies to the inhabitants of this Province
