



The Examint. went ashore to Mr. Hoopers, where they got two

Skreens, and Richard Kene, And the said Richard Kene being
Examined saith —

That when he first met with Roger Skreens in Hungar River, he
asked him he came thither, the said Roger answered he was put
ashore at Mr. Henry Hoopers, the said Examint. then asked him
where Mad^{am} Calbott was, he answered she was gone up the Bay
towards her own house, the said Examint. further asked him how he
expressed what his pay, he answered he was wharve it of God
Darvall and Maj. Swall or one of them, and that Mad^{am} Calbott
had promised him a Tith of Tobacco more then Ordinary to put
ashore at Hoopers Island, the Disponent then required of him
what news of Lord Falbott, to which he replied that he had not been
within twenty Miles of him, neither know he anything of him,
but falling into further discourse he said, he knew the Lord would
never come to a byall, the Examint. asked him how he knew that

for
