Whereas Complaint hath this day been made to this board by  
Choatam Empero<sup>r</sup> of Apalacqua against Edward Haman of  
Low. Sta. County for offering to the said Empero<sup>r</sup> and his Indians  
for all outrages, violence and affronts, killing their dogs, throwing  
down their spears, and driving cattle into their Low. Sta. County, threatening  
also to fire their Court house, without any the least occasion given  
him by the said Indians to their great grievance trouble & indignation  
and contrary to the peace of the L<sup>o</sup> -

ORDER therefore that the Sheriff of the said County of  
Low. Sta. County forthwith upon receipt hereof take into his custody  
the body of the said Edward, and him safely and securely keep  
until such time as he shall find and give good & sufficient  
security for his future good behaviour, and appearance before  
the L<sup>o</sup> Justice of the said County, at the next County Court  
there to be holden, there to answer the premises, and to stand  
to and abide what shall be by them therein further awarded  
and determined. Hereof fail not, and for so doing this shall  
be your warrant Dated at the Council Chamber at the City  
of St. Maries the second day of March in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year  
of the Dominion of the R. Hon. Charles 1<sup>st</sup> King of Great Brit<sup>ain</sup>  
1684:

M<sup>o</sup>nd about the 20<sup>th</sup> of January last (viz) 1684: Our  
Richard Stoveny, with our Richard Bailey and William  
in a boat about 16 fowle k<sup>o</sup> bound, and on their voyag<sup>e</sup> from  
Shoptank to Northampton County in Virginia putt on shore at Watts  
or Gabriels Island adjacent to Accomack County, and in the boat  
about or under 20000<sup>o</sup> of w<sup>o</sup> value, the men being on shore  
w<sup>o</sup> the boat, by a fire, in the close of Evening came 4 Men (viz)  
Our Roy. Makete, our called Mr. Smith, our other white man, and  
one
