

One Negro came to the boat, with 3 people appertaining to one
 M^r. Jenkins plantation on J^r. Island; Two of the men entered the
 boat, Roger commanding to putt off, Stevens forbid, and laid
 hands on the grappling, Roger violently thrust him from it
 into the water, and commanded them to putt off, which they did,
 all the 4 men being visibly well armed with guns & swords,
 one other of Rogers crew, and one of the Islanders went into
 a shallop then riding by, and went off in company with the
 aforesaid boat, in the mean while Roger with many
 threatening words, and daunting expressions in company with
 other two Islanders staid at the waterside; about two hours
 after the aforesaid 4 men returned in the shallop belonging
 to Roger, having left Stevens boat and goods (as they supposed)
 upon some other Island not far distant; Roger ordered 2 men
 of the Island to stay armed all that night at the waterside, to
 guard the said Makisles and Confederates water vessels which were
 two; himself and crew with one called Currier of the Island
 going to his house, which was about a mile distant. Next Day
 Stevens and the other two going to the house, found them drinking
 and feasting with Rum or Brandy, Mutton Curkeys &c. but
 would not entertain or receive whom they had robbed. After
 two days and nights being thus detained fasting &c. Roger ordered
 one of his crew, and one of the Island crew to fetch the said three
 men on shore, where upon a small boat was launched which
 had layen hid amongst land-woods, and fetch them on shore to
 the main; Landing them in a remote place upon Marshes,
 and immediately returned, but packed from them some of their
 cloths for their satisfaction. The said Bailey, and William may
 be in Dorset County, if think fit to be better informed, but
 Stevens made oath to the substance of the above relation
 in Accomack Court and that he knew Roger by former
 acquaintance. About a fortnight following a sloop
 with about 8 or 900 of goods being bound to the Eastern
 shore from the Western, coming to Anchor under J^r. Island,
 two men went on shore, where were with many large quantities
 invited to come: all of the men on shore, and refresh themselves
 with fresh provisions, a brife being then hanging up Calley killed
 and fresh mutton, but one Thomas Lyler who lay under board at
 J^r. Island in a bad sloop loaded with plank and other Lumber
 who will know said Makisles, and observing his design to betray
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
