I have recd: yours of the 5th of May by Lord Digges
I recd with the copy of your late transactions with the
Indians, for which in the behalf of Virginia I returne you
my thanks.

I likewise find in yours your great forwardness to trye
Lord Talbot, and that you desire me to transmitt the evidence
and witnesses against him to your next Provinciaall Court
being the 26th of this instant; I cannot but think you
are mistaken in your measures, knowing the fact
with all the circumstances is represented to His Maj^{ty}
and His Commandos where he shall be tryed and daily
expected, which when I have recd: shall be communica-
ted unto you, but in the interim I am so farre from
answering your desires, that I do hereby command
Lord George Talbot as my Prisoner in the King of Eng^l
name, and that you doe forthwith safely convey him
into Virginia and give me notice thereof, that I
may receive him at your hands, he being legally committed
to prison by us in the Kings name, from whence he shall
unlawfully make his escape; And to this my
demand I expect your ready assistance and
compliance upon your allegiance to His Maj^{ty} as
