Gentlemen,

To the Proprietors  
of the Province  
of Maryland  
Gentlemen

Whereas I am informed by Letters which I have very lately received from Col. Jailer, Col. Digges, and Major Sewall, that Col. Geo. Talbot hath surrendered himself by Government of Maryland in hopes to receive his Tryall there, and being also made sensible that it formerly was, and still is the Kings pleasure the said Talbot shall be brought over in the Quaker Ketch into England to receive his Tryall there, and that in order therunto the said Major has sent his Commands to the Governour of Virginia to deliver him to Capt. Allen Commandant of the said Ketch who is to bring him over thither, I do therefore hereby order and Require you upon sight hereof to deliver or cause to be delivered the said Talbot to the Governour of Virginia to the end the said Major's pleasure may be fulfilled in this matter, without of you are not to fail and so forth
