

liberty thereof, or place near adjacent thereto, by killing the
 Poultry, rooting up the Gardens, and fields, and otherwise; It is
 therefore enacted, ordained and established that no person whatsoever
 inhabiting within the Bounds of this City shall for the future
 raise or keep any hogs, piggs, Sowes or Barrowes, without they
 be kept in a good & sufficient Hoggs pen And that if y^e Constable
 doe at any time after the Twelfth day of November next ensuing doe
 or shall any manner of hogs to come or stay or be within y^e City
 not being in such sufficient Hoggs pens as aforesaid contrary to
 the true intent thereof, that he doe cause the sd hogs to be pounde
 and kept in such place or pound as he shall think fitt to secure them,
 where the said hogs shall remaine till the Owner doe pay to the
 sd Constable six pence apiece for the pounding such hogs piggs
 or shoats or other hogs whatsoever.

Item - It is further enacted, ordained and established that from hence forth
 forward the Constable of the said City for the time being doe and shall
 every year in the month of August take a list of all and singular
 the Inhabitants capable persons within the said City, and make a
 returne to the Hon^{ble} the Court to be held for the said City a faire
 list of the names and surnames of all and singular the Freeman
 and Servants and Negroes inhabiting therin; that for the Court may
 further ord^r therein as to them shall seeme meet, and the same to
 be returned to the Councill upon making up the publick Levy
 for such year, and the Levy to be layd upon the Capables of
 the said City when occasion shall require.

Item - It also is hereby Ordained enacted and established that y^e Constable
 of the said City for the time being shall on the last Saturday in
 every month to commene from the date thereof, goe in and
 upon the severall roads and high waies leading to in, and about
 the said City, and view and see the same roads, and if occasion require
 take with him sufficient help and assistance from the Inhabitants
 therin as he shall think sufficient for the repairing, clearing,
 amending, and making the aforesaid roads, passable both for
 horse, cart and foot, and what charge may accrue thereby
 the same to be paid and allowd out of the Hue and Fees therin
 as shall be layd or imposed upon any person by the Court.
