

Humbly sheweth

a Proclamation

Proclam^{ation} conc^{erning}
Act of Trad^e

Forasmuch as by an Act of Assembly of this Province made in
the Eighth year of the Dominion of the R^{oy} hon^{ble} Charles the
Second D^{uring} 1683: Intituled an act for advancement of Trad^e.
It was Enacted that no person or persons being Inhabitants
and taxable in this Province shall at any time or times after
the last day of August 1685: transport and carry in any boat
or vessel whatsoever from any plantation or plantations, or
from any other place or places save the Town or Ports in the
said Act mentioned to any Port of this Province: or on board any ship
or vessel whatsoever any Tobaccos, goods, wares, and manufactures
of this Province, under penalty and loss of such Tobaccos, goods,
wares and manufactures of this Province, together with the loss of
such sloop or boat or other vessel, that shall have transported and
carry the same or the value thereof in manner and form as in the
said Act is expressly mentioned and set forth: And whereas the
Inhabitants taxable of this Province are not as yet qualified
and supplied with necessary and convenient slooped Boats or other
vessels to have transported and carry such Tobaccos, wares and

Manufactures
