

Law of War, or to save them at his pleasure; And by his Deputie  
 by us hitherto appointed to do all and very thing which unto the charge  
 and Office of a Captain Generall of an Army; or Admirall of a Fleet  
 belongeth. And likewise in case of any Rebellion Tumult or  
 Sedition either upon the Land within our said Province and Dominion  
 or upon the Seas, to exercise Martiall Law against all Rebels, Army  
 Mutinours or Seditioners, who shall refuse to submit themselves  
 to our Government, or to serve in the warre, or shall flye to the  
 Enemy, or forsake their Ensignes, or be Traytors or Straglers  
 or otherwise howsoever offending against the Law Custom or Discipline  
 Military, as freely, and in as ample manner as are found as any Cap-  
 taine of an Army or Admirall of a Navy by vertue of his Office  
 might or hath accustomed to use the same; And further Wee do  
 give and grant unto our said Deputie some full power and  
 authority during the time of his Exercise of the said Office by  
 his Deputie by us hitherto appointed as aforesaid, for us and in our  
 Name, and as often as his said Deputie shall thinke fitting from time  
 to time to pardon, remit or remit whether before Judgment or after  
 all and all manner of criminall Offences against the Lawes of  
 our said Province and Dominions or any of them, and also all and all  
 manner of paines penalltie and forfeitures incurred or to be incurred  
 by any person or persons, Bodies politick or corporat within our said  
 Province and Dominions or any of them for or by reason of any  
 crime or crime Offence or Offence committed or to be committed  
 against any of the Lawes Ordinances or Orders of our said Province  
 hitherto made, or hereafter to be made whatsoever or howsoever  
 as fully and amply to all intents constructions and purposes as Wee  
 our selfe may do being personally present in our said Province. And  
 also for us and in our name, and as often as his said Deputie shall thinke  
 it necessary from time to time to call Assemble, and summon any Generall  
 Assembly or Generall Assembly of the freemen of our said Province, or  
 of their Deputie or Deputies, for the giving of the advice, assent and  
 approbation of the freemen of our said Province, to such Lawes and Acts  
 as shall be by us at any time ordained made and enacted, and under  
 our hand published, and unto which the Advice Assent and approbation  
 of the freemen of our said Province shall be at any time requisite and  
 necessary. And the said Generall Assembly and Assemblies soe from  
 time to time called, Assemble and summoned, or to be called Assemble or  
 summoned, from time to time, when and as often, as his said Deputie shall
