

W^{ch} having spent upon and considrd of for som: time they Desir^d to know who that other Person was w^{ch} w^{as} accus^d to w^{ch} unjust was mad: him that it was Was-taw whom w^e accus^d and Demand^d to b^e deliver^d up.

They seem: much trouble^d and absolutely Desir^d any such thing with full protestation affirming that he was no: way concern^d in the murder.

It was then Demand^d of them that since they certainly know & had so: continually affirm^d that Was-taw was none of the murder^{rs}, they would thin declar: who was the other Person herein concern^d. They answer they know not.

Was then given by the L^{pp} in charg: to the Chanc^ler to tell them by the Interpreter that those two men (to say Araramus and Manahawton) w^{ch} were now carried forth W^e did certainly know to b^e guilty of the murder laid to their charge and here for the L^{pp} did Desir^e to know of them whether or no: they thought yet w^e should proceed against them as against English men in y^e like case.

They say that the L^{pp} had him now in custody & might do: as he thought good.

They were then given to understand that the L^{pp} had not secur^d the prisoners without first making his Demand according to the Article betw^{en} them & us w^{ch} w^{as} Desir^d to know whether they were willing to continue or not. Whereunto having signify^d their free consent and Desir^d the L^{pp} was pleas^d to give them further assurance that he would s^{er}ve & confirm the League with them so: long as they should keep y^e faith towards the L^{pp} and the people of the Govern^{mt}.

The Emper^{or} and y^e rest of y^e Indians go: apart to consult by thems^{lv}s only the Interpreter Major Boardman and M^r John Stone at their request go: with them.

The Lord Prop^{ty} and his Council in y^e mean: times consult together what course to take with the prisoners whether to putt them to Death or fore: y^e great men go: or keep them som: longer time. W^{ch} being putt to the vote it was by the Major's agr^{ee}ment and advis^d that the most secure way would b^e to cause them to b^e presently executed, and that in order hereunto when the great men returned the Interpreter b^e order^d to repeat to them again all the particulars and circumstances of y^e murder. The Discoverer thereof, which appearing so: clear and plain the L^{pp} having Demand^d them according to the Article is at last fully resolv^d to have Justice Don: upon them and that immediately b^e fore their faces.

The Emper^{or} and y^e rest of the Indians returned from their Debate together wth Major Boardman and M^r John Stone.

Who having take themselves apart as follow: viz: That formerly they were in the Dark that now God had open^d their eyes to that w^{ch} they could not thereto perceive, that therefore they did now deliver up Araramus and Manahawton to the L^{pp} as y^e murderers of y^e English according to the L^{pp} Demand, that Was-taw y^e other Person accus^d
