and that he knew it very well, asking him if his Conscience
did not accus him, that M^r. Foster had delivered a List of
the Troopers Names to M^r. Hill in whose hands he the said
Barre: saw the same; And further the Deponent saith that
the next morning Capt. Gooder asked the said Barre: if he
did remember what he had said the night before; to which
the said Barre: in hearing of this Deponent replied that
he did very well repeating the same words or words to the
same effect over again — further adding that this Business
had been made knowne in England, that M^r. John Darnall
while he was there being taken for his Brother Col: Darnall
was summoned before the King and Council, but finding the
mistake he was again dismissed. — Several other words
to the same purpose were at y^e same time spoken by the said
Barre: w^{ch} the Deponent cannot now remember and therefore
further saith not —

Blakiston Examined saith that on y^e 30th Day of Decemb. last in the
afternoone he went to Capt. Gooders house whither came also
ashore from aboard Shipp Doct^r. Barre: and William Rofwell
where falling into discourse M^r. Barre: was very rude and
troublesome using severall aggravating words and speeches
to all the Company (and that before they began to Drink)
calling them Rogues Heretick rogues, withall telling M^r. Rofwell
well that he was excommunicated for keeping ~~him~~ with
Hereticks, and that he did not question but they would all be
made quiett enough, that there was a troope of Catholicks
ready to destroy all the Protestants in the Countrey und^r Tho:
Courney and Col: Darnall (but w^{ch} was to be Chiefe the
Deponent remembers not) more then that Capt. Gooder
discourseing with the said Barre: made answer, why for? why
Tho: Courney before Col: Darnall? to which Barre:
replied in Latin for expedition sake; Gooder making this reparte
what because he is a Horse Courser? w^{ch} is the summe of
what the Deponent remembers to be said that night; Next
Morning the Deponent taxed M^r. Barre: with what he had said
over night how he had abused M^r. Rofwell to w^{ch} Barre: made
