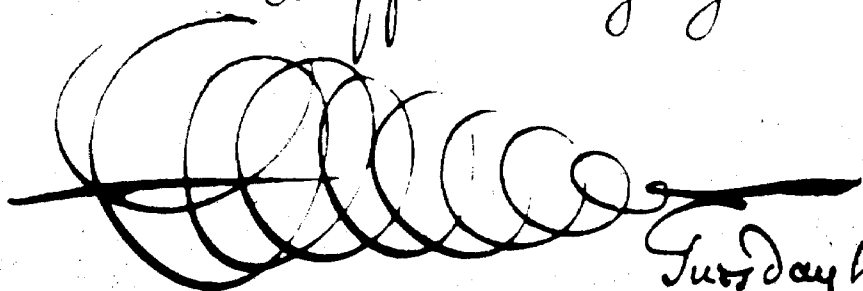

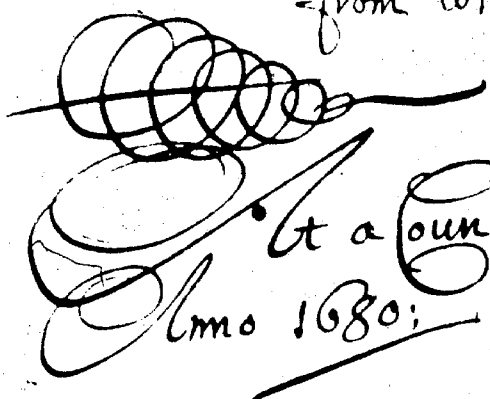
June 16th 1680.

Proposed by his Ex^{ty} to his Council whether or noe it might
be convenient to endeavor to speak with y^e said Indians and
treat with them touching y^e late league made with them in
ord^r to prevent their making any Incurfions upon the frontire
plantations that lye in their road, what means were fitt
to be used for that purpose and who they looked upon as the
most proper man to be Employed therein.

Upon mature Deliberation and Consultation whereof had it was
concluded and Advind to be very materia^l and necessary to
speak and have conference with the said Indians in their march
down, and that Jacob Young being a fson that understands well
the language of the said Indians is the fittest man they can
think to propose to his Ex^{ty} for that purpose. It was
therefor ordered that the said Jacob Young be accordingly
Employed
