

Ans^r No, nor are they Sennequos, there are they say seven Forts of them, one Fort of naked Indians, and some French joynd with them, those Indians they met with did give them an Acc^t of such a man as the Frenchman was, and advised them if they met with him to bind him, and if the English met with him to take him and hang him.

Qu^o Whether or no was the other French man they had with them bound
Ans^r No he was free and at Liberty was married and had been among them four years

Captain Richardson declares that the French Prisoner at his first examination by M^r Vauweringen did affirm that those Indians from whom he came did brag that they had killed some Women and taken some Children

The Indians say that not long since (viz^t) two or three days ago, they met with about 16 of the naked Indians going after the new York Indians, who had hurt the English Woman, and the Negro Woman, with whom they discoursed the matter, and asked them why they did so much mischief to the English who did them no hurt at all, they replied they were hired by the French so to do, their King being at wars at home with the English but they likewise said they would do the English no further mischief but would come and make peace with them and bring a Present woud now returne back and go no further which accordingly they forthwith did

Qu^o When do they intenc to come and make the peace
Ans^r About a month hence, ^{either} four or six of them will come to Sachaja or Mattapony cove^r Suctos

Upon further consideration had of the French Prisoner, it is Ordered that he be taken from the Sheriff of Anⁿ & trundell County in whose Custody he at Present is and committed back into the Custody of the Sheriff of Saint Maries County, from whence he came, there to remain safely and closely confined, till further Orders, and such time as may have further advice concerning those naked Indians that may be the better able to give an Acc^t thereof to the neighbouring Govern^{rs}

Teguafino One of the Great Men Indians on the Eastern Shore, complains and shews to the Board here, that whereas he had sold or Barterd away a Howe with an English man in Cabbins Creek, his Name he knows not, nor can describe him to the Satisfaction of the Board for some certain Number of Matchcoat eight whereof were behind and yet unpaid which the said Man refuses to pay and satisfy to him according to agreement, he prays his Excellencys Order to Compel him therunto

so soon as the Partys name could be known or discovered he may have an Order according to his request

Afterwards it being suggested and made appear to the Board here by circumstances such descriptions as the said Teguafino could give, of the Person accused he obtained and had granted to him this following Order viz^t By his Ex^{ty} the Gov^r & Council 16 August 1693 Maryland
