Was then produced and read to the Board the following Deposition of John Lee concerning the tumultuous transactions at Talbot County Court (viz)

The Deposition of John Lee of Talbot County in the Province of Maryland aged about one or two and twenty Years being sworn saith That on Wednesday at night being at the Court in Talbot County it being <sup>then</sup> January Court Anno 1692 M<sup>r</sup> Huids, and M<sup>r</sup> Carl, and M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Smith, and M<sup>r</sup> Lillingston and others in Company was not willing that he should leave them, but some of the Company brought M<sup>r</sup> Huids Horse, and tyed him to the bar in the Court House and after that the said M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Smith with M<sup>r</sup> Samuel Withers the Sheriff of Talbot County and another whom your Deponent thinks was M<sup>r</sup> Richard Bonnet put themselves in the Pillory and because M<sup>r</sup> Huids was Drunk, the said Samuel Withers and the other person put the said Huids his Stillyards in the Room and stead of the said Huids, and further your Deponent saith not Sworn before me this 5 day of Sept<sup>r</sup> 1692 J<sup>n</sup>: Lee.
