County of Somerset to give Bail as is required

And your Petitioner shall ever as in duty bound pray &c

which Petition was thus answered and endorsed viz

By the Governor and Council Oct^r 11 1692
Upon a Petition this day preferred to this Board for and in be-
half of William Morris of Somerset County a Prisoner in the custo-
dy of the Sheriff of St Marys County Ordered that the said Morris
paying or securing to be paid his fees due for his Imprisonment
&c and also the charge of his transportation hence into Somerset
County may have the Liberty of being transported thither unto the
Custody of the Sheriff of the said County there to remain untill he
shall find good Security for his good behaviour and appearance
at the next Provinciaall Court to answer what shall be laid to his
charge
