Whereupon it was now ordered that the Certificate in the petition mentioned be recorded in the Land Office as is prayed

That whereas many misprisions have been committed by Surveyors formerly in this Province both in courses and distances, through whose neglect and Ignorance in the pursuance of the trust reposed in them many inconveniences happen to the Inhabitants of this Province and whereas your Petitioner hath held some Land by Patent from the Lord Proprietor these thirty Years, which through the ignorance of the Surveyor some Errors have been committed

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that a warrant of re-survey may be granted to your Petitioner according to the ancient Limits and Bounds of the said Land, that if any Surplusage do appear within the said ancient limits and bounds, it may be returned and returned to the use of your Petitioner

And your Petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray to the foregoing petition was annexed the following paper of the bounds of the land mentioned in the petition as follows

Beginning at a Marked Oak in a neck between two branches & running from thence South West Southerly untill it shall intersect the branch of a Creeke called Charne Creeke, from thence run up along the said branch unto a marked white Oak standing at the head of the said branch from thence Running along North East untill it shall intersect a South east Line drawn from the first bounded tree bounded on the said intersection, and running back North West unto the said first bounded tree
