The Deposition of Gilbert Turberville of St Marys County Gent aged five or six & forty Years on the oaths as follows vizt

The Deponent upon Oath taken on the holy Evangelist saith that on or about the 12 day of this Instant Month having been at Church & going home with Mr Garret Vansweeringer & Mr John Evans between St Inigos & Mr Pattisons Plantation, the said Vansweeringer began a discourse saying there were two Dukes of Gloster, the one was Prince Georges Son adopted in England the other King James Son Born in France & that the French King had sent a safe conduct into England for the Nobles to come over into France & see the birth of the Prince & that the Queens Body was exposed to the view of several of the Nobles & two Bishops at the time of her Delivery who did see the Child Born into the World that there were Articles of Agreement between the Kingdom of England & King James publickly up & down in print everywhere in England in every Boys hands & a General Pardon for all excepting some few Particular men Doctor Burnet particularly named in the Pardon, & the Bishop of London exempted out of the Pardon & no Jesuit
