Susq. Indian: Says there are two Parties of them one gone to the Northward, ^{design} to join with the Sinniquos in their war & these here have desire to set down among us & to beat peace they are called the Stabberwute Indians

Int: What thinks he of the Twittawese whether or no will they come amongst us, again to give us any further Trouble

Ind: Yes he says he Believes that when the Leaves come to be a little Bigger they will come & disturb us

Inter. Since then we have taken such care as to build Forts for our defence, & their discovery, they may as they have said way lay them & take of them what they can, which will be of good use & service

Ind: They did intend so & will so do if they can

M^r. Jacob Young is ordered to attend this Board about the 25th Day of May next with those Indians

The said Jacob Young humbly moves the Board that having some Action depending in the Provincial Court he cannot have convenient Leisure to inform the Indians what has passed this day concerning them as is required of him by this Board & be at the Court likewise in time which may be of great Prejudice to him

Resolved that an order be directed from this Board to the Justices of the Provincial Court to defer the action or Cause wherein Jacob Young is concerned till another Court that he may the better Pursue the order of this Board in relation to the said Indians
