

Security demanded of him for the due Execution of his Office
 he do give his own personal Security in one Thousand Pounds
 & that each of the ten County Clerks do give one hundred £
 security for the due performance of their respective places that
 the Act for regulating of Ordinaries whereby the benefit of
 Licenses for Ordinaries formerly belonging to the Secretary is
 given to the Governor may be disallowed by his Majesty

That the Order of the Governor & Council of Maryland of the
 17th of August last by which the Chancery writs that have
 been always issuable out of the Secretarys Office are appro-
 ved to be issued out of the Chancery & the fees thereof be paid
 to the Chancellor may be set aside & the benefit of issuing those
 Writs do remain to the Secretary according to the Act of Assembly

That their Lordships do not find cause for any alteration
 in relation to the fees of the Naval Officer as at present settled
 by an Act of Assembly in consideration of the trust reposed
 in the Governor for the execution of that Office

His Majesty in Council is this day pleased to approve there-
 of & to order as it is hereby ordered that the said Sr Thomas
 Lawrence do enjoy the full benefit of his Office of Secretary
 of Maryland according to his Letters Patents upon giving his
 own personal Security in One Thousand Pounds & that each of
 the ten County Clerks do give one hundred pounds security
 for the due performance of their respective places

That the Act intituled an Act for regulating Ordinaries passed
 in the Assembly holden in Maryland the tenth day of May last
 & an order of Council dated the 17th of August following concer-
 ning chancery writs be as they are hereby set aside & disallowed
 & that the benefit of issuing those writs do remain to the Secre-
 tary according to the Act of Assembly

That there be no Alteration in reference to the fees of the Naval
 Officer as at present settled by an Act of Assembly in Maryland in
 consideration of the trust reposed in the Gov^r for the due Execu-
 tion of that Office & that the several particulars proposed in
 the said report be duly complied with by all persons whom it
 may concern
