eign Plantations that when they send any prin-
ted Proclamations in, they will be pleased to send
enough for the Eleven Counties the Inhabitants giving
more regard to such then written ones

Capt^e John Hamer Timian an Indian Trader
at the head of the Bay being asked concerning the
Indians that live there what Nations they are, he
says they are Chauchannuts Susquehannuts & Pi-
luware that the Chauchannuts are about forty men
& live at a Town fifty miles of his house the Susque-
hannuts are about fifty men live two miles further
up at Caristangua & come from the Senegues

That the Delawares live at white Clay Creek are
about forty men

Captain Hamer being asked whether the Susque-
hannuts live in this Province says they live about
thirty miles above Ocerara Creek

And that their King having been lately taken
by the Naked Indians Intends according to his pro-
mise to go back to the said Naked Indians who desire
to be in Amity with this Government and that the
said King of the Susquehannuts will not go his jour-
ney without the leave of this Gov^t
