

That the Indians on Susquehanna River
have constant trade with persons in Philadelphia &
Newcastle

It is proposed advised & agreed that inasmuch as
this Board do not find that the said Indians have given
this Government that a Letter be writ to his Excellency
the Gov. of New York to acquaint him of the Application
made to this Government by the said Indians on
Susquehanna River & that we not knowing but these
Indians tho they call themselves Susquehannas are
Indians belonging to the Senecas & if care be not ta-
ken therein this Government may perhaps be a Recep-
tacle for them

That we are not willing to have any Correspon-
dence with them without the Consent of that Gov.

And as to the Application of the King of the
Susquehannas for leave to go to the Natick Indians
it is ordered that a Letter be writ to Genl. John Thomas
to acquaint him this Government will not meddle
therewith, but that he may tell the said Indians that
whilst they behave themselves well & peaceably they
may freely go & come without Disturbance & if the
said Indians have any thing else to propose to his
Excellency they will do well to come down to him

Advised & agreed that a Letter be writ to his Ex.
Edm Andros to desire him to forbid all the Mas-
sachusetts Ships in his Government to take on Board or
carry away Mr John Coode Sr Mr Philip Clark
Mr Robt Mason & Mr Guzman by but that he will
take Effectual Care to have them apprehended in his
