Major Walter Smiths for 30 £ in all amounting to one
hundred & twenty six pounds six Shillings & two
pence three farthings, the same ought not to be allowed of,
but that Esq^r Plater should charged therewith, & remit so
much to M^r Ridgons or M^r Wilner in order to procure
the former out of Council for Arms to be sent in & that
until the said M^r Plater satisfy his Excellency the Gov^r
that he has remitted so much for that end, that he send
the Bills by him taken on this Acc^t to his Excellency who
will take care duly to apply the same to the end for which
it is given, and that upon the said M^r Plater making
up his Acc^t his Excellency will give him a receipt which
