And the following Letter signed by his Excellency was
given the said Indians who were told not to give Credit
to any Flying Storys but always apply themselves to
the Gentlemen appointed by act of Assembly to decide differ-
ences between the English & them

Gentlemen/ Port of Annapolis July the 11 1698

By the Inclosed you will see the Indians Com-
plaint which they make to me about their Lands & there-
fore to the end no Misunderstanding may happen between
them & us I do command you to make due Enquiry there-
into & endeavour to settle that matter with them which if
you cannot do, you are required to send an Acc^t thereof
to the Council about the 8th of September next at Anna-
polis where it will be considered & adjusted. I am
