His Excellency is pleased to say that he has been told that M^r Germaine Sly upon his T^{up} yesterday heard the Kings Evidence with means used to subvert them & that he offered M^r Philip Clark to prove nine Articles against him

Therefore proposes the said Sly be this day brought before the provincial Court in order to be examined thereon
