

The being asked whether he was contented with the
 Judgment of the Court of Admiralty for having intention
 to oppose to his Majesty in his most humble Duty (owned
 to say he has no such Intention but submits himself
 wholly to his Excellency's Kindness & Favour and con-
 descends only what had been agreed on his behalf he re-
 ceives his humble thanks to his Excellency therefore

Ordered that the Charges upon Seizure & Condem-
 nation of the Brigantine be adjusted & when discharged
 that a tenth part of the Clear prize be paid to Colonel
 Mitchell who gave notice of the Arrival of the Vessel

Ordered that publick notice be given that whosoever
 gives Information of the Breach of any the Acts of Trade
 and Navigation that such persons for their reward
 shall have a tenth part of the prize if condemned

Whereas his Excellency has promised in case the
 Assembly agree to make an Hospital at the Cool Springs
 to give towards it 25 £ Sterl he does declare himself well
 satisfied in that the Brigantine is condemned which
 he hopes is sufficient punishment to deter the Owners
 from any further illegal Trading & that he does not desire
 any private Advantage thereby to himself & will remit
 Captain Tove his third part provided he pays thirty pound
 to the poor at the Cool Springs towards building the Hos-
 pital before mentioned which is to be in Lieu of his Exc-
 ellency's promise of 25 £ to that use

To the which Capt Tove was consenting & gave
 his Excellency many thanks for his Generosity & Kindness

Ordered that Geo Plater Esq^r his Majesty's receiver
 of the District of Tuxcon take care to see the Vessel
 and Cargo appraised and his Majesty's share secured
