of the Justices of the shire should tender the said Oaths  
to such his Lordships Officers or other persons whom they  
shall find to be disaffected within their respective Counties  
Saving to the said Coll<sup>o</sup> Henry Darnal his Lordships  
Receiver who stands excused by his Majesty's order in  
Council
