

A Decision on the Point in Question might be more likely to reconcile the Incumbent and Vestry; They for that purpose think proper to recommend to the Vestry, as it is really a Matter of Justice & Equity, to make Mr Lang a reasonable Satisfaction out of the Tobacco in Question, for what He has expended or is lyable to pay on Account of any such Buildings and Improvements as He has made on the Glebe, and which might be necessary and convenient, for the Incumbent to have, Mr Lang giving sufficient Security to indemnify the Vestry for any Tobacco so allowed him, and that whatever Tobacco (if any) Mr Lang has actually received from the Vestry out of the Tobacco in Dispute, to be deemed a Part of what shall be allowed him
