

March 23. 1777.

Ordered that the western Shore Treaſure pay to John Green, one
Pound, six shillings, and nine pence, for a part of his account.
That the said Treaſure pay to Robert Green-

one thousand pounds, a bill.

That the said Treaſure pay to John
Bullock Dr. Master one hundred and fifty pounds, a bill.

Charles Russell of Cannington Esq: for the
Senate delivers to the Governor and Council, the memorial of the
Reverend Mr. John Bowie, praying that the General Assembly
would resume the consideration of his case; this endorsed. "By the
House of Delegates. March 23rd 1777. Read and referred to the Governor
and Council, to determine whether the said Bowie be committed, bailed, or
discharged, and that they have full power to commit, bail, or discharge
in their discretion. G. Dewart A. H. D. By the Senate. March 20. 1777.
Read and referred to the Governor and Council for the purpose aforesaid
"By order R. Ridgely E. S.", which was ordered to lie on the Table.

The Petition of Daniel Nelson praying a Discharge
from his confinement was read, and rejected, the Council of Safety having
reported to the General Assembly, that the offence, with which he stands
charged, is not bailable by Law.

Ordered, That the western Shore Treaſure
pay to Mrs: Fisher of Harris, nine pounds, and three pence, it
being the Balance on Contract for Lucia jacket.

On reading the Memorial of the Revd
Mr. John Bowie, it was ordered, that the Officer of the Guard,
who has charge of the Revd Mr. John Bowie immediately
attend the Governor and Council, with the said Bowie in custody.
