(Whereas an Order passed this Board on the 13th Day of this Instant Month
of March reciting amongst other things that no Affidavits or Proofs had been trans-
mitted to this Board against the Rev^d John Patterson requiring the Sheriff of
Baltimore County to discharge the said John Patterson from his custody and
Whereas the said Order was founded on mistake William Bradley Esquire having
transmitted to this Board the Evidence taken before him on Oath and also
certified the sayings and Speeches of the said John Patterson before him Wherefore
it is ordered that the said former Order be Suspended and that the Sheriff of Bal-
timore County discharge from his custody the said John Patterson on his giving Bond
to this State in the Penalty of one thousand Pounds with sufficient Security to
be approved of as such by some Justice of the Peace for Baltimore County Condi-
tioned for his the said John Patterson peaceably and quietly demeaning ~~and~~ himself
and for his not doing any matter or thing against this State or the Independence
or Government thereof during the present War with great Britain.

Mr. Ridgely and Mr. Stevenson from the House of Delegates
delivered to the Governor the following Resolve —

By the House of Delegates March 20. 1778.

Resolved That the Governor and the Council be empowered to Dispatch
Immediately a Messenger to Congress requesting a supply of One hundred
thousand Dollars on Account of the United States for the purpose of purchasing
Provisions for the Continental Army. By order of Duwall S. H. D.
which said Resolve was then endorsed By the Senate March 20th 1778
Read and assented to A. Ridgely S. Sen.
