Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Elizabeth Tuck, Twenty six Pounds, five shillings due her for account passed by the Aud. Genl.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Edward Duwall of the 2^d Regt as much Serge Denim as will face a Coat, and make up Brushes and Waistcoat and also a pair of shoes.

Commission of a Letter of Marque and Reprisal issued to Levin Truppe commander of the Schoop Stabella 40 Tons Burthen, mounting 6 Carriage Guns, 4 Swivels and 6 small Arms belonging to William Kull of Baltimore.

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt William Campbell 1 Coat, 1st Bonnets, 2 shirts, 2nd shoes, 2nd stockings, 1 Hat and 1 Blanket for Joseph Dudge who enlisted in the room of William Lee.

Commission of Letter of Marque and Reprisal issued to Peter Houston commander of the Schooner Johnson 40 Tons Burthen mounting 4 Carriage Guns, 2 Swivels and 6 small Arms belonging to John McClure, William & Thomas Johnson of Maryland.

Commissions issued to David Robertson appointed Capt. in the room of John Reynolds - William Dickmon 1 Lieut, William Robertson 2^d Lieut, Aaron Downes Ensign - Cooper Kenderdine Ensign of Capt Thomas Hughlitts Co. - William Shipley Capt Richard Mason 1 Lieut, Thomas Cooks 2^d Lieut, John Green Ensign belonging to the 20th Battalion also to Richard Collison 1 Lieut, Joseph Kullikin 2^d Lieut Henry Bowdler Ensign of Capt John Mitchells Co. Joseph Douglaf Capt in the room of Hugh W. That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Thomas Beall six thousand Dollars for the use of himself Capt Adamson Jamchill & Adjut. Josiah Jamchill Officers of that part of the late Rawlings Regiment raised and recruited in this State unless of the Articles
