A Petition of Fielder Bowie of Prince Georges County complaining of an undue and irregular election of Sheriff for the said County being presented to this Board It is ordered that an hearing on the said Petition be had before the Governor and Council at Annapolis on Tuesday the 2^d Day of November next and that a Copy of this order ^{be served} Thomas Williams on or before Saturday the 23^d day of this Instant and that Summons issue for Witnesses on the Application of any of the Parties —

Permission granted in Pursuance of the Recommendation of Congress of the 2^d Instant to the Schooner *Willing* a Vessel belonging to Mess^{rs} Thomas Archer H^o of Virginia commanded by Capt Hunt to load and transport to Virginia for the use of that State, a Cargo of Flour, a Manifest of such Cargo being lodged in the Naval Office at Baltimore and the vessel there cleared out and a Bond being given to this State in the Penalty of one thousand Pounds with good and sufficient Security conditioned that if the said Cargo shall be delivered to the proper Officer appointed to receive the same in Virginia, the Danger of the Voyage excepted and that a Certificate of such Delivery from the Board of War of the said State of Virginia, shall be produced to the Governor and Council of this State within two Months from the Time of the said Vessel clearing out then the Obligation to be void &c —

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to James C. Murphy a Soldier, late of Capt Lucas's Company of the old Maryland Regiment who lost one of his Legs in consequence of a Wound received in the Battle on Long Island in 1776, two hundred Pounds so much allowed him up to the first Day of next Month by this Board by Virtue of the Resolution of the General Assembly of the 9th of August last —

That the said Treasurer pay to Eleanor Gibson thirty Pounds an Allowance made her up to the first Day of next Month by the Governor and Council by Virtue of the Resolution of the General Assembly of the 14th August last —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Samuel Madam a Soldier in the 5th Regim^t discharged the amount of Twenty nine Pounds, ten Shillings in Cash due him per Act of Assembly to procure Proops for the A. Army —
