Ordered that Mr John Randall State or Sub Treasurer be directed to purchase on the best terms proper with sufficient to make up the Number of two thousand pair of shoes for the use of the soldiers of the Quota of the State in the Continental Army.

That the western shore Treasurer pay to the above John Randall one thousand Pounds to be expended in the Purchase for the use of the Army and accounted for.

That the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Parker one hundred and seventeen Pounds and him per Account passed by the Aid Gen^l.

That the said Treasurer pay to Mr William Hemmels two thousand seven hundred and ninety eight Pounds sixteen shillings and three Pence to be accounted for.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Matthew Duer Esq^r the amount of Twenty nine Pounds ten shillings in Clothing to be delivered over to Joseph Ewertt who was a private Soldier in the 2^d Maryland Regiment and now regularly discharged and him by a Resolⁿ of a Assembly to procure Troops for the American Army.
