Ordered that the western shew Treasurer pay to William Goddard one thousand and seventy one Pounds, two shillings and eleven Pence and one thousand, seven hundred and twelve Pounds, ten shillings due him per Ac<sup>t</sup> passed by the Depy Aid.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Unsworth one hundred and thirty seven Pounds, ten shillings per Ac<sup>t</sup> passed by the D. Aid.

That the said Treasurer pay to Eng. William Boyce one hundred and twenty six Pounds, seventeen shillings and six Pence due him per Ac<sup>t</sup> passed by the Aid. Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut Isaac Duvall one hundred and seventy eight Pounds, two shillings and six Pence due him per Ac<sup>t</sup> passed by the Depy Aid.
