Present as on yesterday

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Mrs Mary Ghuwler, six hundred and forty five Pounds, sixteen Shillings & Eight Pence due her by Act passed by the Asst. G<sup>l</sup>

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Berry six hundred Pounds on Act

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Thomas Armstrong a 9 Months Soldier in the 6<sup>th</sup> Regiment Discharged the Amount of Twenty nine Pounds ten Shillings on Clothing due him by an Act to procure Troops for the American Army.

That the said Commissary deliver to Patrick Lynch of 7 Regiment on St. Brackets

Permission is hereby given to Mrs Ann Connolly, Margaret Connolly and Rachel the Daughter of the latter, all of this State, to solicit Leave from his Excellency General Washington or the Commanding Officer at the Out posts of the American Army at Elizabeth Town to go into the City of New York with a view of going immediately to Ireland, not to return again into this State during the present War between America and Great Britain without the Leave of the Governor & Council for the Time being first had and obtained.

In virtue of a Resolve of the General Assembly of the 29<sup>th</sup> Inst License is hereby granted to Mr Monros to ship on board Lebonhomme Richard, one hundred Barrels of Flour and one hundred and fifty Barrels of Bread for the use of Le Tres Rodrigue a fifty four Gun Ship to person of twenty two Guns Ladem Elomes of sixteen Guns, Lebonhomme Richard also a Ship & two Brigs all now lying in Virginia, Provided that Mr Monros on clearing out Lebonhomme Richard make Oath that the Provisions permitted to be exported are intended for the use of the crews of the vessels above mentioned and not for Sale.

Ordered That Mr John Shaw deliver to Capt Berry of the Plater Lead Staff for Spans for 8 Swivels and 80 Powder

That the western shore Treasurer pay to John Brew Esq<sup>r</sup> six hundred and Eighty Pounds for his Attendance in Council to this Inst inclusive

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Robert Berry six hundred Pounds on Act

Mr Robert Kimmell is recommended by this Board to His Excellency Genl Washington or the Commanding Officer at Elizabeth Town for his License to go into the City of New York for the purpose of obtaining a Passage to Great Britain.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to His Excellency Thomas Tom Lee Esq<sup>r</sup> four thousand one hundred and sixty six Pounds, thirteen Shillings & four Pence for the use of the Honble John Rogers due him for 12 Months Salary as Chaneller to the Asst. G<sup>l</sup>

That the said Treasurer pay to William Hensley Esq<sup>r</sup> Twenty five Thousand Pounds in part payment for two hundred Barrels of Flour purchased of him by this Board.
