Warrant issued, Directed to Isaac Grisel to impress all the Vessels and hands in the Port of Baltimore in the Bay Trade (except those employed in carrying Provisions to the Head of Elk for the use of the Army) to Transport the Troops of the United States from the Head of Elk to the common Wealth of Virginia to reinforce the Southern Army.

Capt. Joseph Middleton's Vessel, a Schooner Boat, has been impressed by our Order to go to the Head of Elk to Transport Troops from thence to Virginia, but as she is at present engaged in the Public Service she is to return from Baltimore to Annapolis.

Lieut James King, You are to take under your Care and Direction the Schooner Planters Friend Nathl. Rofs, The Schooner Liberty Thomas Dellow, The Schooner Speedwell Thomas Kingdon & the Schooner Boat Richard Brewer which Vessels are permitted to touch at Baltimore to unload and from thence you are to proceed with them to the Head of Elk for the purpose of Transporting a Detachment of the American Army to the State of Virginia, You are to apply to Lt. Hollingsworth at the Head of Elk for further Orders.

Lieut. James Skinner — You are to take under your Care and Direction The Schooner Dispatch, The Schooner Sally Nicholas Valliant, The Sloop Fly, The Schooner Sea Flower Thomas Johnson and the Polly Boat John Valliant impressed for the Purpose of Transporting a Detachment of the American Army to the State of Virginia and when you arrive at the Head of Elk you are to apply to Lt. Hollingsworth for further Orders.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Edward Dyer of the 2^d Regiment 3 yds Linn for Lining and 2^{ps} Stockings in part of the Articles call. by the Genl. Assembly

That Capt George Keports deliver to Doct. Ephraim Howard 50. or 60 lb Cannon Powder, provided it sells for more than £13- in Baltimore & if more Dr Howard it to pay him the price it sells for.

On Considering the Memorial of William Logan of the City of Annapolis respecting the Damages done to his Wharfs and warehouses lately occupied by this State — The Govern^r & Council are of Opinion that the State is bound to make good the Damages arising since they were employed by them, and direct an Order to be drawn to the said William Logan for the Sum of Six thousand Pounds in full for the Damages.

Ordered That the western shew Treasurer pay to Elias Vaillette Twenty Six Pounds due him of Account passed by the Aud. Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Lt. Uriah Frost one thousand, one hundred and fifty six Pounds for the use of John Henry & fifteen Pounds for the use of Lt. William Bondly due them of Accounts passed by the Aud. Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Francis Cromwell Fifty four Pounds of Au! passed by D. Aud.

That the said Treasurer pay to William Logan Six thousand Pounds in full for the Damages done to his Wharfs & Wharfe by the State Vessels agreeably to the Determin^t of the Govl. & Council.
