

Thomas Johnson, John Callahan, David H. Hurd, Nicholas Hamwood & Joseph Conner are appointed Signers of the Bills entitled in virtue of the Act to enable the Treasurer of the western shore to draw and sell Bills of Exchange and for an Emission of Bills of Credit if necessary.

On Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> September 1780

Present as on Yesterday;

Resolved that the western shore Treasurer pay to Robert Davis four hundred and fifty Pounds due him of an Act passed by the Depts. Act.

That the said Treasurer pay to Nichl. Hurd one hundred & fifty Pounds on account.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Bryan one Pound seventeen Shillings and six Pence in the Bills emitted by this State in lieu of seventy five Pounds due him of account passed by the said Act.

That the said Treasurer pay to Danl of Thomas Knifer Esquire three hundred Dollars of the new Emission of this State on account.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Moot one hundred Dollars of the new Emission on account.

That the Collector of the Tax in Dorchester County pay to John Moot Esq. one hundred and nine Pounds eight Shillings & four Pence due him of an Act passed by the said Act.

That John Moot Deliver to Perry & Middleton 200 lb of Meat and 500 lb of Bread & Flour.

Commissions of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued to Gilbert La Roche Commander of the Schooner Young & Leptine 25 Tons burthen, navigated by 30 Men, mounting 10 carriage guns & 6 howitz belonging to a Messrs. La Caze & Mallet of Philadl. also to Joseph Rudoff Commander of the Schooner Rejoice 80 Tons burthen navigated by 24 Men, mounting 12 carriage guns and 2 howitz belonging to Dumaw of Baltimore and also to Bucket Talon Commander of the Schooner Army 40 Tons burthen, navigated by 12 Men mounting 3 carriage guns & 2 howitz belong to Mr. Smoot & Tho. Russell Mayr.

& Proclamation.

Whereas full Power and Authority is given to me by and with the Advice of the Council to continue the Act entitled an Act to prohibit for a limited time the Exportation of Wheat, Flour, Rye, Indian Corn, Rice, Bread, Beef, Pork, Bacon, Lard, Stock, Peas, Beans, Oats and other victual and for other Purposes, from and after the tenth Day of this Instant until the end of the next Session of the General Assembly and to issue my Proclamation accordingly; provided the Embargo be continued in the States of Pennsylvania and Delaware, so that the Trade of Delaware Bay be not open for the Emolument of the People residing on the Waters, or in the Vicinity thereof. And it appearing that the Embargo hath been continued in the State of Pennsylvania until the Thirtieth Day of this Month and in the State of Delaware until
