John Greer's company of Artillery Linen for 2 shirts and 10 sh for a waistcoat & Breeches  
and also 1 pair of shoes and stockings to be accounted for.

That the collector of the tax for the Montgomery County pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Solomon  
Sympson (contractor for Waggon and Carriage in said County) Twelve thousand Pounds  
to be accounted for.

That the joining Commissary deliver to Capt William Beatty of the 7<sup>th</sup> Regt  
8 Gallons of Rum 22 lb Sugar & 10 lb Coffee in full of those duties all by the Genl  
& Secretary for 2 May, June July and August.

Permission is hereby given to Doctor Hedington and Sam<sup>l</sup> Stanning of  
this State to sail aboard from the Gallies of the Washington or the Commanding Officer  
at the Port of the American Army at Elizabeth Town to go to New York  
in the Purpose of obtaining a Passage from thence to Great Britain not to return again  
into this State during the present War, without the leave of the Gov<sup>o</sup> & Council.

Resolved that the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Price Two  
hundred and fifty Pounds of the new Emision of this State to be delivered over to Col<sup>o</sup> Joseph  
Dashall Commissary for Worcester County and to be so sum accounted for.

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Price Eighty seven Pounds  
in full of the sum due him by the Debtors.

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Thomas Landale Twenty five  
Pounds Seven Shillings and nine Pence Fourteen Shillings and eleven Pence farthing  
of the new Emision due him & to be paid by the Debtors.

That Col<sup>o</sup> George Dashall pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Joseph Dashall Commissary  
for Worcester County Ten thousand Pounds out of the money received from the Classes  
who have not furnished substitutes on account.

Whereas Job Greene of Baltimore County did on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Decr  
1700 enter into Bond with Securities in the Penal sum of Two thousand Pounds payable  
to the State of Maryland with Condition that he the said Job Greene should in all  
things demean and behave himself as a good true and faithful Subject of the State  
and that he should not go out of Baltimore County without the leave of the Govern  
or & Council of this State first obtained in writing: And whereas it does not appear to this  
Board that the said Job Greene leaving the said County will be of any prejudice to the  
State the said Job Greene is hereby permitted to leave Baltimore County at his plea  
sure notwithstanding the Condition of the above mentioned Bond.
