That the said Treasurer pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Samuel Smith 6 hhdts of Tobaco at Magruder Warehouse Weigh<sup>t</sup> 5037<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> dated in 1780 to be accounted for at £50 p<sup>r</sup> hhd. & 4 p<sup>r</sup> Cent

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to a Negro Perry belonging to this State one Coat one Jacket 1 p<sup>r</sup> Braces, 1 p<sup>r</sup> Shoes and 1 p<sup>r</sup> Stockings

That the Spring Commissary deliver to Quah Dunham, Boy<sup>l</sup> Andrews and Daniel Andrews 2 Days Provisions each to enable them to proceed on their way to Boston, they having been captured by the Enemy.

Whereas It appears to this Board that by the Operation of the Act of Assembly Entitled "An Act for the immediate Supply of Flour and other Provisions for the Army" 205 1/2 Bushels of Wheat and 375 Barrels containing 723 2/9 of Flour were seized in the Hands of Col<sup>o</sup> Sam<sup>l</sup> Smith at that time acting as Agent for the State of Virginia under the appointment of the Executive of that State

Resolved therefore that the Commissary general be requested & he is accordingly requested to give a receipt to the State of Virginia for the said Quantity of Wheat and Flour as so much of the specific Supplies required by Congress from that State & that the same be charged to the State of
