

In Pursuance of the Resolution of the General Assembly of the 13th Inst^o The Board look into Consideration the Case of Thomas Price and after deliberating on the circumstances thereof are of Opinion that his going at large would be dangerous to the State and therefore order that the said Thomas Price be confined to the Limits of Dorchester County not to depart therefrom without the leave of the Governor and Council for the time being and to be of good behaviour in the mean time and that the said Thomas Price enter into Bond with good and sufficient Security in the Penalty of one hundred Pounds specie to comply with the said Order. —

That the yeilding Commissary deliver to Lieut John Kelly of the 3rd Regim^t of Light Dragoons and Doct^r Kelly of the 5th Regt^t, each, four gallons of Rum and fifteen pounds of Sugar due to the 1st Instant

Special Commission of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery issued to Frederick County directed to the Honble Robert Hanson Harrison and Alexander Gentry Hanson Esquires and Upton Sherburne, James Johnson, William Murdock Beall and Philip Thomas Gentlemen or any three or more of them in virtue of the Act entitled an Act to enable the Governor to issue Commissions "of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery in certain Cases" and agreeable to a Resolve of the General Assembly of the 20th Instant

Friday 22nd June 1781.

Ordered that the Storekeeper deliver to Lieut William Goldsmith of the Select a Miska one pair Horse Poles to be returned when called for. —

That the yeilding Commissary deliver to Lieut Edward Sellard of the 4th Regim^t four gallons of Rum and forty pounds of Sugar due to the 1st Inst^o.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt Jonathan Selman of the 4th Regim^t scarlet Cloth sufficient for Fringes for a Coat. —

Saturday 23rd June 1781.

Commission of Letters of Marque and Repisal issued to Peter Sharpe Commander of the Brig General Gift, one hundred and twelve Tons burthen navigated by thirty men mounting ten Carriage Guns belonging to Thomas and William Johnson Daniel Hopkins and Jompy Baltimore Town. —

Ordered That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Ensign John Sears of the 2nd Regim^t Cloth for a waistcoat and Breeches to complete the year 1780 and also to Lieut Elyah Evans of Rawlins's Regim^t a Suit of Cloaths and Linen for two Shirts for the present Year. —

That the yeilding Commissary deliver to Capt Jonathan Sellman of the 4th Regim^t four gallons of Rum and fifteen pounds of Sugar due him to the first Instant. —

That the western Store Treasurer deliver to Stephen Neward two Hhd^s of Tobacco weighing two thousand and fifty six pounds of 1780. at Indian Landing which is to be returned. —
