

Friday 3^d August 1781

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to John Gray M^r Hubm Fifty three pounds, fifteen shillings and two pence specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debt due from this State per Certificate settled by the Aid Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Benjamin Harwood eight hundred and thirty four pounds and two pence specie agreeable to the said Act per Certificate passed by the said Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Samuel Thomas Esq. Thirteen pounds fourteen shillings and also one hundred and forty four pounds, two shillings & eleven pence specie agreeable to the said Act per Order passed by the A^d Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Isaac Harris seventy two pounds, eight shillings & specie agreeable to the said Act per Certificate settled by the Aid Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Col^o George Steaker two hundred pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds of the money appropriated for the present Campaign, one hundred pounds thereof to be delivered over to Philip Thomas Esq. Lieut of Frederick County and the other hundred pounds to George Murdoch to be by them accounted for.

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Denny Fifty Dollars of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid to be delivered over to W. Le Gar of South Carolina and three other Gentlemen from that State on their way to Philadelphia to be repaid by W^o Le Gar to the Maryland Delegates in Congress & to be by the said Denny accounted for.

That the said Treasurer pay to John H Stone Esquire, Twenty two pounds of the same Emission of the money appropriated for the Defense of the State on Account.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Hugh Keane later a Jotter in the 2^d Regim^t one hat, one coat, one vest, one shirt & one pair of Shoes. - & also to Col^o Woolford fairs for a coat & lining for a waistcoat.

That the Spunging Commissary deliver to Commodore Graison fifty pounds of Tallow for the use of the Revenge Intrepid & Terrible Barges.

That the Storehouse deliver to the said Commodore Graison as much Wadding or Lint for making Wadding as he may think necessary for the above Barges.

Commissions issued to Thomas Beatty appointed Captⁿ Conrad Doll Lieut. and Henry Hoffstadter Ensign of a company of Select Militia raised in Frederick County.

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to His Excellency Thomas Smth Lee Esq. one hundred and twenty five pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds of the money appropriated for the Defense of the State on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson jmt two pounds of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid to be expended in necessaries for the Council on Account.

Ordered
