

On Monday the 14th of November 1791.
it being the second Monday in the same month The
General Assembly of Maryland proceeded agreeably
to the Constitution and Form of Government to the ap-
pointment of a Governor, when the honourable George
Plater Esquire was unanimously elected who attended
the same day in the Senate room and qualified in presence
of the Members of both Houses, by taking the several Oaths
required by the Constitution and Form of Government and
Laws of this State and by making and subscribing a
Declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion —

On Tuesday the 15th day of the same month
the General Assembly elected the following Gentlemen, Council
to the Governor to wit James Bruce, Henry
Bridgely, Randolph Brandt Latimer, John
Hoskins Stone, and John Davidson Esquires

Wednesday 16th November 1791.

His Excellency George Plater Esquire attended
John Davidson Esquire appeared
in the Council room, and qualified before Allen Duym Esq^r
one of the Justices of the Peace for Ann Arundel County, by
taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form
of Government and Laws of this State and making and sub-
scribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion and
also by taking the Oath for the Support of the Constitution of the
