The Council met. Present as on Yesterday

The Council took into consideration the Resolution of the General Assembly authorizing them to adjust the account of Frederick Gun against this State for printing the laws compiled by William Helty, and having examined his statement accompanied with sundry certificates of Printers as to the value of said work and compared the same with the allowance for printing the laws heretofore edited by the Chancellor of this State, did thereupon determine that the sum of eight hundred Dollars was due to the said Frederick Gun in addition to the sums already paid him by the Treasurer. Whereupon ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the said Frederick Gun the aforesaid sum of eight hundred Dollars out of any unappropriated Money that may be in the Treasury in full satisfaction of all claim on part of said Gun for printing the aforesaid work.

Tobias Rudolph and Stephen Hyland were appointed Associate Justices for Cecil County and Commission issued to them accordingly.

Samuel Maffitt and Doctor Thomas W. Vazey were appointed Justices of the Levy Court for Cecil County vice David Sheridan and John Rumsey resigned, and Commission issued to the said County including them.

Henry George, Thomas Maffitt, and John Gilpin were appointed Justices of the Orphans Court for Cecil County and Commission issued to the said County including them.
