The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble
Allen B. Duckett, Presvdy. Gherlwin and Edward Hall

Lewis Duvall and Lancelot Warfield Junior, were appointed Justices
of the Peace for some counties and a new Commission issued to the
said County including them.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Minian Pinkney
the sum of Twenty five pounds for Three Months Salary as Clerk of
the Council, due the first instant.

Ordered by the Governor, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore
pay to Lieutenant John Trueman the sum of fifteen pounds for
one quarter's half pay due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to the Honble Gabriel
Duvall, the sum of one hundred and Eighty seven pounds Ten
shillings for one quarter's Salary as Judge of the General Court, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to the Honble Allen
B. Duckett, Presvdy. Gherlwin and Edward Hall, the sum of
fifty pounds each for Salary as Members of the Council, due as
above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to William Harwood Esq.
Twenty eight pounds Two shillings and six pence, for one quarter
Salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Colonel John H. Stone,
forty two pounds Ten shillings and Nine pence for one
quarter's half pay, due as above.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to John Belmont one
pound eighteen shillings and five pence for Riding Expence
as per account paid.

By the Petition of William Sommersell and Gerard Taylor of
Calvert County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings
of the Court of the said County it appears that they were
presented at September Term 1799 in two several Presentments
for selling Spirituous liquors without licence and were fined
by the said Court the sums authorized by law. The Petitioners
state that William Sommersell did obtain a licence to sell
