

it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of ten pounds for his appearance at the said Court at April Term 1800 to testify against Thomas Clarke on a Presentment for beating Negro Jacob the property of Benjamin Durall. The Petitioner states that he would have attended agreeably to the said Recognizance but was informed by a certain Hugh Henry McFarms one of the witnesses that the case was taken out of Court and submitted for decision to a certain Levi Gantt, Cogges. The Petitioner further states that he did attend the said Court at April Term 1802 and gave Evidence against the said Clarke on the Presentment aforesaid and the said Clarke was discharged by the Court. The Petitioner states that he is a poor Man. The Board on consideration and from the Recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the same.

By the Petition of Patrick Daugherty of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at September Term instant in four several presentments the quantity of six hundred pounds of Tobacco on each for selling liquors and keeping ordinary without licence. The Petitioner states that he obtained a licence from Prince Georges County Court at September Term 1800 for keeping an ordinary at Bladensburg in said County. The Petitioner states that previous to his removing into this State he kept an ordinary in the State of Virginia where it is the practice for the Sheriff to call annually on all persons who have obtained a licence to keep an ordinary for the sum due from them and that believing the like practice prevailed in Maryland he omitted to apply to the Court. He therefore prays to be released from the above fines on his paying six pounds the cost of the licence. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of the said fines except six pounds current Money
