By the Petition of Ignatius Clarkson of Montgomery County it appears that he was presented at November Term 1803 and fined for selling liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that Honore Martin did in the Year 1803 obtain a licence to retail Spirituous liquors for one Year. that in September following the said Martin and the Petitioner entered into partnership under the name and firm of Ignatius Clarkson and Company - that the Petitioner and Co continued to retail liquor under the licence aforesaid, until March Court 1804 at which time they obtained another licence. that being doubtful whether they could with propriety sell under the licence granted to Honore Martin, application was made to the Associate Justice by the said Honore Martin for a Permit but could not obtain one. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.
